



## PHOTOGRAPHY PROTOCOL

The K.C. Irving Environmental Science Centre & Harriet Irving Botanical Gardens is a unique natural setting in the Acadian Forest Region that provides a beautiful location for your photographs.

Visitors are welcome to take photographs for their personal use. Those visitors who wish to use the Centre and Gardens for portrait or landscape photography must reserve the facilities at 902.585.2665 (BOOK) or [reservations@acadiau.ca](mailto:reservations@acadiau.ca). Portrait photography includes wedding, family, engagement, prom and graduation as well as some corporate photographs.

**NOTE:** Commercial photographers must present a contract for facility usage.

The Centre and Gardens are open to the public 365 days per year, weather permitting. Admission is complimentary. Guests are encouraged to make a donation to the K.C. Irving Environmental Trust; donation envelopes are available at the reception desk and the café.

For your safety and to preserve the uniqueness of the Centre and Gardens, please adhere to the following code of conduct during your photography session:

- Use the designated parking areas (metered or permit parking, as appropriate) found on campus ([http://security.acadiau.ca/campus\\_map.html](http://security.acadiau.ca/campus_map.html)).
- It is prohibited to smoke or use tobacco products on Acadia University property.
- Visitors may be accompanied by service animals; pets are prohibited on the premises.
- Use ear buds or headphones when listening to personal audio equipment.
- Balloons, confetti, rice, sparkles, and bubbles are not permitted on the property.
- Dispose of any refuse, compost and recyclables in the main lobby receptacles.
- Do not sit on staircase railings or lean over the oculus railing on the Upper Level.
- Respect the furnishings and their layout; do not damage, deface, move, remove or stand on the furniture.
- Keep entrances, staircases, hallways, pathways and other access areas clear at all times.
- Use foot paths and turf areas for walking and not areas that are planted, mulched or wooded.
- Do not injure, disturb, damage, deface or remove any plant, plant part (e.g. plant labels or containers), garden feature, rock, cultural material, bird, animal or structure for any reason.
- Do not climb up fences or walls, walk on or enter into water or other garden features.
- Place backpacks, props and equipment on the ground or a garden bench.
